Whom will God send today?

We are now well into Jesus' Galilean ministry, the one he began in Nazareth in Galilee. Last Sunday contained a surprise development: it found three of the greatest witnesses in the Bible—**Isaiah, Paul and Peter**—expressing their own worthlessness!

The First Reading was about the call of Isaiah: "*Whom shall I send?*" (Is 6,1-8) The next two readings were about the apostles, those who were sent by Jesus to carry his message and carry on his work (1 Cor 15,1-11 and Luke 5,1-11).

Who are Jesus' apostles in our world? Whom will God send today?

When God wants to send a message of love to the outcasts of this world who will say "*Here I am; send me!*"

When God wants someone to speak out in the halls of government on behalf of the voiceless who will say "*Here I am; send me!*"

When all the world marches out to war and God needs someone to march in the opposite direction, a messenger of peace who will say "*Here I am; send me!*"

As the world suffers from the ill effects of the injustice it has caused, and the Church offers a way out through its social thinking, where are the Christians who will bring that message to the world? Who will say "*Here I am; send me!*"

The Christian calling has to do with what is known in Christian social thinking as the common good. Christians are called to work for the good of the human family. It is an urgent task, requiring people who have a sense of God's justice and are committed to peacemaking.

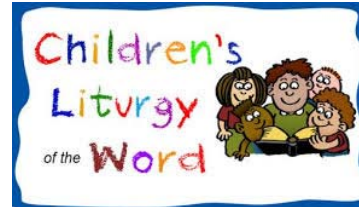
Mark your calendars for our annual **ST. PATRICK'S DAY POTLUCK** celebration on Saturday, March 16th
