## **March 8<sup>th</sup>, 2020 – Second Sunday of Lent**

## **Reflection on The First Sunday of Lent**

The first reading from the book of Genesis reminds us of the creation of the world and of the first humans – Adam and Eve. Having reminded us of the beauty of Creation and of all the good that was in it, it then recalls the great sin of Adam and Eve as they gave in to temptation. Eve was tempted by the serpent and in their conversation, she speaks of the Lord's command regarding the two trees and of the consequences of breaking that command. The serpent persists and the man and woman do what was displeasing in the eyes of God, and the moment they do so they realize their nakedness which becomes an embarrassment to them and they try to cover themselves, which perhaps could be seen as their attempt to cover up their sin. The Psalm asks for forgiveness from God for our sins while acknowledging that we do know our own sins.

St Paul tells the Romans in the second reading that sin came through one man (Adam) but that all people have been redeemed through another man – Jesus Christ. In the time from Adam to Moses there was no Jewish Law and so there were no laws to be broken but still people sinned. Paul was emphasizing that just because a written law was not broken does not mean that people have not sinned and sin cannot be seen simply in terms of breaking a written law. Even without laws people can still sin against God and his will. But as man brought separation from God so the original unity has been restored by Man because, despite whatever sins were committed, God's freely given grace is always greater and the effect of grace is greater than the effect of sin.

In the gospel we see Jesus – truly man like us – being tempted by the devil while fasting in the wilderness following his baptism. He is visited by the devil who tempts him in three different ways with the key to each being that Jesus should cease to love God and to place his future on earthly ideals. Jesus resists these temptations because of his adherence to the word of God, because of his faith in God and ultimately because he loves God. The three temptations represent a choice between good and evil (bread), between life and death (Temple), and of power and riches (kingdoms). The readings challenge us to be faithful to God no matter how we are tempted, no matter what the choices placed before us are, no matter how much better, easier, and happier it might appear to be to do the wrong thing than to choose God and true life.

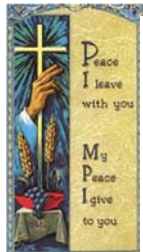
**'cause everyone is Irish when celebrating St. Patrick's Day!**

**Pray the Stations of the Cross on April 10<sup>th</sup> 2 p.m. at All Saints**

The Stations of the Cross are a 14-step Catholic devotion that commemorates Jesus Christ's last day on Earth as a man.

The 14 devotions focus on specific events of His last day, beginning with His condemnation. The stations are commonly used as a mini pilgrimage as the individual moves from station to station.

At each station, the individual recalls and meditates on a specific event from Christ's last day. Specific prayers are recited, then the individual moves to the next station until all 14 are complete.
