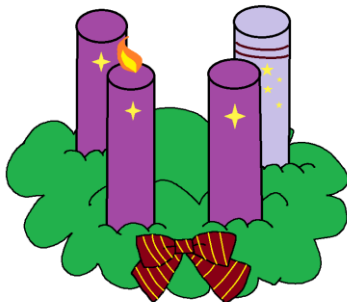

First Friday Mass and Night Vigil at All-Saints

The English-speaking Mission will celebrate mass on **Friday, December 6th, at 7:00 in the evening**, followed by adoration hours during the night.

The arrangement of adoration will be divided between different parishes. A priest from the mission will be present during the night.

Between Friday 7pm and 9:30pm All Saints will take charge, followed by St. Bernard until midnight. From 12 to 5 am, St. Elizabeth takes charge.

Pilgrimage in Poland

The English-Speaking Catholic Mission in Berlin invites you to join them on a 6-day pilgrimage from 21-26 May 2025 to some of the most beautiful and holy places in Poland. This will include the shrine of Our Lady Czestochowa, St. Faustina's convent, the Divine Mercy Sanctuary in Cracow, the birth-place of Pope John Paul II, and much more. A Catholic pilgrimage is more than visiting a historic site or viewing religious relics: it is a journey with a higher purpose: to honor God and grow in faith. A pilgrimage is an opportunity for conversion of the heart.

The pilgrimage will be led by a bilingual guide (German-English), though the principal language will be English.

Cost: €760 per person in a double room. The fee includes hotels, meals (except lunch), transport, tour guides, and entrance fees.
